Drafted Layout	better at building your business' identity than you might expect  - Frequently Asked Questions: if you have two or more pieces of info for existing clients/customers, this is a great place for that info  - Testimonials: helps add authenticity to your business; be sure to add multiple, just listing one could backfire  - Mission/Vision Statment: a great way to define what makes your business unique		2
Form Setup	When someone fills out the contact form on the website, it needs to get to the correct place. I also need to make sure that they're human!		1
Payment Processing	The registration form on your website provides conditional discounts and integrates with PayPal. This will take a while to build and test, but it'll definitely streamline your registration process.		5
Content Edits	There will be smaller edits I need to make after getting your feedback. More specifically, stuff like fonts, colors, and background images may need to be ajusted. Occasionally, the positioning of content will need to be rearanged to make the site easier to navigate.		2
